



Now entering its eighth year, the premier property and infrastructure summit for Greater Western Sydney brings together the leaders and city shapers in government, development, construction, design, planning, transport, housing, services, energy and sustainability.

Boomtown! has always been where the big players in property and infrastructure come together to discuss, debate and collaborate on the development of the dynamic growth region.

Importantly, we always tackle the big issues facing our region. In 2022 we challenged the shortfall of affordable housing in Greater Western Sydney and explored how governments can leverage public land and transport investments to fast-track the future development of key local sites. We also examined how fast rail, metro rail and light rail will drive and direct future development across the West.

We can never forget that we are not just an economy, but a society, and this provision of social infrastructure, and liveable and loveable cities are also important.

Other key elements of the 2022 Boomtown! program included a review of individual and commercial land that can be opened by enabling roads and utilities to provide jobs and what we can do in the sustainability space to make Greater Western Sydney a more circular economy

Pemulwuy Prize & Leadership Awards Lachlan Macquarie Lecture

Western Sydney Leadership Dialogue

Pemulwuy Prize and Western Sydney Community Leadership Awards

Named after the famous Aboriginal warrior and leader, the Dialogue presents The Pemulwuy Prize annually to honour a leading citizen, or group, who has made an outstanding contribution to the region.

If one person can be identified as the earliest warrior for Western Sydney it was Pemulwuy – who became a heroic figure to Aborigines who revered him for his incredible capacity to evade capture and death for many years during his campaign in their defence.

To honour his memory, the Pemulwuy Prize is awarded annually in conjunction with the Lachlan Macquarie Lecture, and selected from one of the Dialogue's Community Leadership Award winners.

Lachlan Macquarie Lecture

In honour of Governor Lachlan Macquarie, and in the spirit of his strength and vision for the city, a prominent citizen delivers an annual speech about their personal vision for this dynamic region.

Lachlan Macquarie, a British military officer and colonial administrator, served as Governor of New South Wales (1810 to 1821.) Macquarie believed that the future of the colony was in Western Sydney and was the region's first great advocate, sponsoring the development of the river cities of Penrith, Liverpool & Parramatta.

CLP invests in the professional development of an invited cohort of existing and emerging leaders from organisations with an interest in Greater Western Sydney.

In June 2022 we staged the inaugural bespoke professional development program for a selected cohort of our region's existing and emerging leaders, with candidates drawn from the private, public and community sectors. They enjoyed a deep immersion in local communities and institutions and were provided with a unique and intimate exposure to eminent leaders.

The annual program delivers technical training in collaborative culture, thought leadership, regional advocacy and community engagement, and will generate a stellar professional network for graduates.

With a rolling program of workshops, interactive learning, cultural immersion site visits and networking events with exemplar practitioners, we provide unmatched exposure for the cohort to key people and experiences to expand their capacity to govern, build, advise, assist and advocate for GWS. The graduates, the organisations they represent and this region will all benefit.

The CLP will run once again in June '23 with a new cohort of 35 future leaders.

- What are some of the key factors that have influenced this latest outbreak and why is it so different to last year's lockdown?
- How did Greater Western Sydney emerge as one of the central hot-spots and has there been an improvement in how important health messages are both communicated, and received?
- Are vaccination rates improving and what has been the response from our communities, particularly Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) groups?
- How are our hospitals dealing with the increased case-load and are we better equipped to deal with more patients than during last year's outbreak?
- What are the medium and long term public health lessons we can take from this latest outbreak?

Our *GWS Future Forum* series is designed as a more intimate workshopstyle forum, to examine how the Government can work with industry and the community to develop real policy solutions to some of the region's major economic, demographic & environmental challenges – as we head toward a population of 4+ million by 2050.

The moderated workshops provide an opportunity for public sector organisations to understand and respond to the major policy challenges in Western Sydney, and work with industry, the community and its peers in the public sector to ensure the region remains liveable and sustainable.

The workshops target key subject areas and bring together relevant government & community stakeholders to build momentum towards real outcomes for the region. Recent events have focussed on subjects such as: innovation precincts; domestic violence & obesity; community infrastructure,; governance; and water sustainability.

The Dialogue has identified a cohort of influential leaders in Western Sydney from business, NGOs, sport, arts, local government, education and other decision makers and use them as an ongoing leadership cohort to engage in a debate about city shaping and binding.

Housing Reference Group

Western Sydney Leadership Dialogue


In December 2019, the Dialogue convened the *Housing Reference Group* (HRG), a social and affordable housing policy forum made up of Community Housing Providers (CHPs) and financiers, academia, local councils, public landholders and various government agencies. The HRG's ongoing discourse aims to identify shortcomings in existing social and affordable housing policy, propose and refine alternative solutions, and generally advocate for the sector in GWS.


This involves moderated discussions with key leaders in the housing sector. The group has previously shared various industry perspectives including CHPs - St George Community Housing CEO Scott Langford, developers - Lendlease Group Executive Toni Milis, community understanding from Western Sydney Community Forum CEO Billie Sankovic and government insight from National Finance and Housing Investment Corporation CEO Nathan Dal Bon.

A major project for the HRG was a land-mapping exercise in collaboration with Landcom. Highlighting the available land in GWS for future social and affordable housing developments, that are within adequate distance to transport and town centres.

The HRG has also been thoroughly consulted on the Dialogue's NSW Housing Strategy 2020 Submission.

CHRISTOPHER BROWN AM | Chairman & Founder

Christopher recently retired as Pro-Chancellor of Western Sydney University after eight years as a Director but continues to serve on the board of the WSU Academy. He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Letters at WSU in recognition of his significant contribution to the university and the region in late 2019. Prior to his appointment to the WSU Board, he was an Adjunct Professor at the Business School at University of Technology, Sydney.

For twenty years he led two of the nation's most powerful industry peak bodies, Infrastructure Partnerships Australia and Tourism & Transport Forum – comprising CEOs from across the upper echelons of Australia's public and private sector leadership cohort.

He formerly sat on the corporate boards of ANZ Stadium, the Commonwealth's Moorebank Intermodal Co, Moss Capital and LUCRF Superannuation before stepping back to focus on his Dialogue role. He has served on numerous government boards and taskforces over the past 30 years including Tourism Victoria, National Disability Council, See Australia, Greater Sydney Partnership and the Infrastructure Security Taskforce and previously chaired the Madrid-based Business Council of the United Nations World Tourism Organisation.

Christopher was a member of the Federal/State Commission that chose the Badgerys Creek Airport site and then devised an advocacy campaign to secure Federal Cabinet support. He also served on the NSW Transport & Planning Blueprint Panel that first recognised Parramatta as Sydney's second CBD.

He is a co-founder and Governor of the Bradfield Partnership & Oration with NewsCorp, Convenor of the Sydney Roundtable think tank and in 2019 led a delegation of Mayors, agency CEOs, Vice Chancellors and business & community leaders to examine urban renewal in the UK's East London area.

Christopher chaired the Western Sydney Rail Alliance, which secured \$5+ billion to build a north/south Metro line to Badgerys Creek and the WestLine Partnership, which secured light rail in the Olympic Corridor.

He founded/led the Parramatta Partnership Forum, Committee for Liverpool, Canterbury-Bankstown Forum and Advance Blacktown regional leadership initiatives. He currently chairs the South Western Sydney Local Health Advisory Board and the Campbelltown Health & Education Partnership collaboration.

Raised and educated in Parramatta, he was awarded Australian Honours for his service to industry and community in 2014.

Adam has nearly 20 years' experience working in the areas of media, corporate communications and public relations.

A former journalist, he has also acted as an adviser at a local and state government level, and managed numerous campaign and advocacy strategies on a range of issues in Western Sydney, including major transport and infrastructure projects such as the Parramatta Light Rail, Metro Airport Rail (linking Badgerys Creek to St Marys) and Parramatta Powerhouse. Adam is a former Western Sydney University graduate, and product of the iconic, Westfields Sports High, in Fairfield West.
